Course Contents:

1. The student has to undertake a project individually or in a group of students (as suggested by the institute).
2. Report is to be submitted by every individual student / Group of students. Student / Group need to select a topic and present their research proposal in front of a panel of faculty members.
3. After acceptance of the proposal, the student /group will undertake a project with guidance of an allotted faculty guide.
4. At the end of semester, as per guidelines by project coordinator, they need to submit report in soft as well as hard copies.
5. The university will arrange the external viva - voce for project report. The student is expected to make a 15 – 20 minutes presentation before the examiner regarding the project work undertaken, which will be followed by questions by the examiner.
