Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject cited above, this is to inform you that various representations have been received in the commission from different universities regarding request for the guidelines for Double evaluation system in Under-Graduate examination of BHMS. In respect of the same, please find below guidelines for your reference:

- (a) All the answer scripts shall be subjected for two valuations by the concerned University. The highest of the total marks awarded by the two evaluators for the paper, which is rounded off to the nearest value, shall be considered for computation of the results.
- (b) All the answer scripts, where the difference between two valuations is more than ten per cent (10%) of the total marks prescribed for the paper, may be subjected to third valuation.
- (c) The highest of the best two total marks, awarded by the three valuators for the paper, rounded off to the nearest value, shall be considered for final computation of the results.
- (d) After the computation and declaration of the results, re-valuation is not permitted by any authority under any circumstances.

Above mentioned guidelines shall be applicable from the date of issue of this letter.

Answer book Evaluation	Answer Book shall be evaluated by two examiners and the average of two assessments shall be the final marks. (There shall not be any markings by any of the Evaluators on the answer-scripts.)
Double Valuation System	Principle: In the evaluation of Question –Answers of Descriptive examinations there is a possibility of variation of marks in each valuation. Double valuation offers a solution to such a situation. The acceptable limit of variation of marks between two evaluations is up to 19% of the maximum marks. After double valuation, in case of variation between both the scores are up to 19% of the total marks, Then average of both the scores will be considered as the final score. In case of fractional scores if the fraction is 0.5 or above it is rounded off to the next highest digit and if the fraction is below 0.5 it is rounded off to the lower digit value. If the difference in marks between the two evaluations is 20% or above a third valuation by another independent qualified evaluator is to be done.
Third Valuation	At the end of double valuation, if the variation between two independent scores is 20% and above of the maximum marks, then such scripts should be considered for third valuation. It is to be noted that at least one of the scores among two should be 35% of the maximum marks.
After Third Valuation	Average of the higher of two scores among all three valuations is considered as the final score.
